

The Demo-Class Checklist

The exact thing that gets your tutoring application **approved** instead of rejected — for Vedantu, Filo & any platform that makes you record a demo.

7 checks + 3 instant-reject mistakes

Most people don't fail the subject test — they fail the **demo video**, over and over, and never find out why. Platforms aren't testing if you're smart. They're testing one thing: **can a confused student actually follow you?** Clear these 7 points and you pass the gate.

THE 7-POINT CHECK — BEFORE YOU HIT RECORD

1 Light your face, not your back

Face a window or lamp. Never sit with a bright window behind you — it turns your face into a shadow.

→ **Dark videos get rejected in the first 3 seconds.**

2 Clear audio beats a good camera

Record in a quiet room. Phone earphones with a mic are enough. No fan, no echo, no TV.

→ **If they strain to hear you, they assume a student will too.**

3 Solve ONE problem, start to finish

Pick a single medium question. Don't explain five things — explain one thing completely.

→ **Depth on one beats a rushed tour of many.**

4 Say the "why" out loud at every step

Not just "now divide by 2" — say "divide by 2 *because* we want x alone." Narrate your thinking.

→ **This is the single biggest thing they score.**

5 Write as you talk

Don't just speak. Write each step while you say it. A pen-tablet helps, but a clear sheet of paper on camera works.

→ **Shows you can teach visually, not just lecture.**

6 Open with a 5-second warm hook

"Hi! Let's break this down together." A friendly first line — no long intro about your degrees.

→ **They're checking student-friendliness, not credentials.**

7 Watch it once before submitting

Play it back. If YOU drift off, a student will too. Re-record — most approved tutors did 2–3 takes.

→ **Rejection is almost always fixable on the next take.**

3 things that get an instant reject

- × Reading off a script in a flat voice — sound like you're talking *to* someone.
- × Filming vertically in a cramped frame — sit back, show your hands and the board.
- × Going over time — keep the demo tight: 2–4 minutes is plenty.

ONE TOOL THAT HELPS

Want every "comment INFO" to auto-reply with your guide?

The way you got this PDF — comment a keyword, get a DM — you can run that on your own posts with **Creator Lane**. Pick a keyword, it watches your comments and auto-sends the DM, so it lands while people are still interested.
